The **Arizona Solar Energy Association** (ASEA) is the Arizona affiliate of the **American Solar Energy Society** (ASES: <http://www.ases.org>). Founded in the 1970's as a technical association of early solar technology professionals, the group has evolved into a diverse assemblage of individuals from all walks of life who share a common interest in sustainable human activity and the use of solar energy. ASEA reaches out to both professionals and non-professionals.

The organization consists of a State Board of Directors composed of representatives from all areas of the State and all walks of life. The directors serve as a resource to local chapters that, in turn, have their own officers and directors. Depending upon local preferences, the local chapters may have meetings, workshops, a newsletter and other activities.

Basic Membership - \$25/year
